





- 4. Impacts from agriculture and industrialization in the country threaten this Biodiversity.
- 5. As a developing or newly industrialized nation.
- 6. Brazil is notable for taking a lead in environmentally friendly initiatives.
- 7. In the field of biofuels, Brazil is the second-largest producer of ethanol in the world.
- 8. It is also home to two sustainable cities.
- 9. Nevertheless, environmental issues remain a major concern in Brazil.
